- Is confused, disoriented or may be experiencing mental health concerns
- Sleeping in a lobby or an unsafe place



This 24/7 service can help connect vulnerable individuals to safe transportation, shelter and the support they need.
By making that call, you could be protecting someone from harm and potentially saving a life.

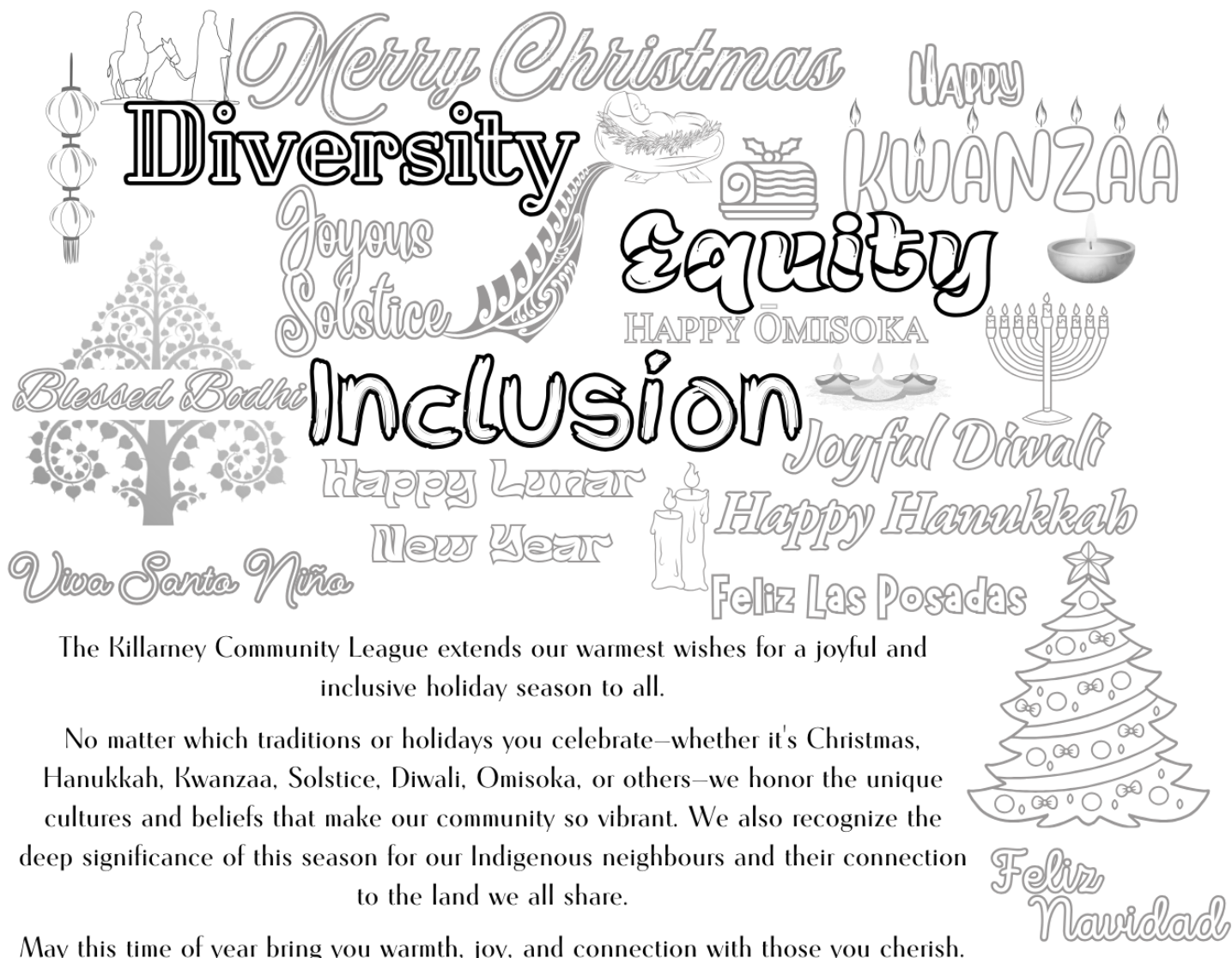

A Killarney Holiday Greeting

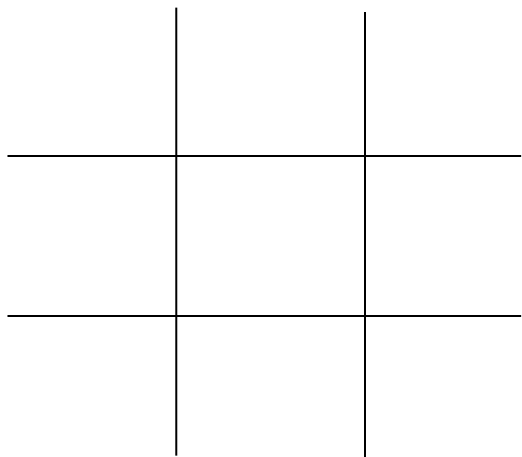


The Killarney Community League extends our warmest wishes for a joyful and inclusive holiday season to all.
